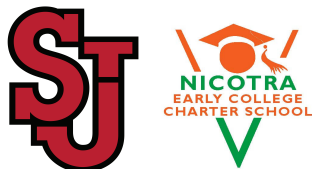

Our Mission

Through our partnership with St. John's University, we intend to promote an accelerated pathway to higher education by enabling students to earn college credits while still enrolled in high school. Admission to Nicotra is open to students currently enrolled in 7th and 8th grade. Incoming students will begin in July 2020.



Nicotra Charter is divided in two phases: College Preparation and Early College

College Preparation Phase (Grades 8-10):

Students are enrolled in accelerated Regents level high school courses designed to prepare them for college as they earn a high school diploma.

Early College Phase:

Eligible students will study on the St. John's University campus and earn credits in both core and pathway courses.

Career Pathways:

Students can choose one of three pathways at Nicotra: Education, Business and Entrepreneurship or Law Enforcement and Criminal Justice.



Eligibility, Application & Deadline

• Applications must be received by **April 1st at midnight** to be included in the lottery.

• All students residing in New York State are eligible to attend Nicotra Early College Charter School.

• Preference will be given for students residing in CSD 31 (Staten Island).

• The lottery drawing will be held on **April 22, 2020 at Corporate Commons One at 1 Teleport Drive, 3rd Floor**. Attendance is welcomed but not required. Results will be posted on our website within two weeks of the lottery drawing.
